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

Newcastle Castle is a historic fortress in Newcastle upon Tyne, England, with origins dating back to Roman times. The site was originally a Roman fort called Pons Aelius, built around 122 AD. Following the Norman Conquest, William the Conqueror's son, Robert Curthose, constructed a wooden "New Castle" on the site in 1080. This structure was later rebuilt in stone between 1168 and 1178 under King Henry II, resulting in the stone keep and the Black Gate, which still stand today.







Mary Shelley (1797–1851) was an English novelist best known for her groundbreaking work *Frankenstein*; or, *The Modern Prometheus*, first published in 1818. Written when she was just 18, *Frankenstein* is one of the earliest examples of science fiction, exploring themes of ambition, isolation, and the consequences of playing god. Shelley was part of a literary circle that included her husband, poet Percy Bysshe Shelley, and Lord Byron. Her novel remains a powerful commentary on human nature and scientific progress, solidifying her legacy as a pioneer of gothic literature and a key figure in the Romantic era.





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ADAM, THE CREATURE

Jamie is a theatre-maker from Gateshead who trained at Bretton Hall and has established an extensive body of roles with theatres and companies across the North East and nationally since 2006.

Having recently toured *Othello* with Elysium Theatre Company, he is delighted to be making his debut for Niltoni Creative.


Other recent credits include writing and releasing his first audio drama *Sero Sed Serio* with Elysium Theatre Company, and directing *Tides* by Joe Dennis.

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












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
