




"A Christmas Carol" by Charles Dickens holds an esteemed place in 19th-century literature, its influence shaping the essence of the modern Christmas celebration. Written in 1843, it emerged from Dickens' impassioned vision, etching a lasting impression on Victorian Britain's cultural landscape. The genesis of this timeless tale sprang from Dickens' acute empathy for the plight of the impoverished, sparked by his encounters in the industrial north of England. The story's protagonist, the infamous Ebenezer Scrooge, personifies unchecked avarice and undergoes a transformative journey, symbolizing the heartwarming essence of Christmas.

The genesis of the character Ebenezer Scrooge adds a fascinating layer to this story. This miserly character drew inspiration from a real figure, Ebenezer Scroggie, a jovial and kindly Edinburgh merchant who led a life far removed from the persona associated with Scrooge. Scroggie's occupation as a corn dealer was mistakenly read by Dickens as 'mean man' during a twilight visit to the Canongate Kirkyard in Edinburgh. This inadvertent misinterpretation gave birth to the character of Ebenezer Scrooge in "A Christmas Carol," published in 1843. Regrettably, Scroggie's legacy was marred by this association, as he forever bore the ill-deserved reputation of a miser. His gravestone, once visible, has since been lost to time, disappearing in the 1930s.

Dickens' commitment to capturing the spirit of the season was unparalleled. During nocturnal wanderings through London's streets, he meticulously crafted the tale, embodying the redemption of Scrooge and the overarching message of compassion and generosity. The book's rapid creation within weeks, driven by Dickens' fervor to share it by Christmas, underscores his dedication to amplifying the festive spirit.



Charles John Huffam Dickens born on 7 February 1812, was an English writer and social critic. He created some of the worlds best known fictional characters and is regarded as the greatest novelist of the Victorian era. His works enjoyed unprecedented popularity during his relatively short lifetime, living to be just 58, dying on 9 June 1870. Oliver Twist, Bleak House, Little Dorrit, Great Expectations, The Pickwick Papers, are just some of his many novels and short stories, many of them featuring ghosts. But arguably his most celebrated and seasonal, is the festive redemption story of Ebenezer Scrooge, in the classic 'A Christmas Carol.





Step into history at Alderman Fenwick's House, a remarkable 17th-century Grade I-listed townhouse in the heart of Newcastle upon Tyne. Originally built in 1670, this building has served many purposes, from being a bustling merchant's house to becoming the Queen's Head coaching inn in the 18th century. Restored in 1997, it is celebrated for its rich architectural and cultural heritage, making it a fitting venue for our immersive production of A Christmas Carol

Charles Dickens shared a close connection with Newcastle, visiting frequently and performing public readings of his works in local halls. His ties to the city deepened through his marriage to Catherine Hogarth, whose father who was the Editor of the Chronicle. Dickens was also a guest at the Queens Head coaching inn, with the Great Room then the Bar and salon of the hotel. Hosting A Christmas Carol at Alderman Fenwick's House in this spectacularr room where Dickens himself would have dined and, as was typical of him, told his stories to those around; pays homage to Dickens's enduring bond with the region and his legacy of storytelling that resonates across generations.

With its period features and historic charm, this iconic venue perfectly evokes the spirit of Dickens's Victorian England, offering an authentic and atmospheric backdrop for this festive tale.
